RE: Maximum Migrant Student Counts for SY 2008-2009

School districts who receive funds to operate a Migrant Education Program have the responsibility of identifying and recruiting all migrant students (ages 0-21) residing within their school district boundaries and enrolling them in the Migrant Student Information System (MSIS).

Every year in the Fall, our office submits counts from the previous school year to the United States Department, Office of Migrant Education, for funding purposes. Included in these counts are the number of migrant students in the state who were enrolled in the Migrant Student Information System (MSIS) the previous school year.

In order for our state to receive maximum funding, please ensure your migrant records clerk has enrolled all migrant students in the MSIS between the ages of 0-21 residing in your school district boundaries during the 2008-2009 school year (regular or summer terms) by **September 30, 2009**, either by using a school building or an out-of-school building identification code.

We congratulate those who have already processed their 2008-2009 school year enrollments in the MSIS for migrant students ages 0-21. Your focus at this time should be to enroll students in the MSIS for this current 2009-2010 school year.
